### HOMESTART AND PARENT PACAJE

We are participating with MAJE (the Milwaukee Association for Jewish Education) in a joint venture to help bridge the gap between home and school.

Homestart is an innovative program designed for families with young children (ages 3-7), to enhance home observance of Jewish holidays. Individual kits and follow-up packets are mailed directly to subscribing families, containing tapes, stories, background information, and simple craft suggestions. In addition, parents have the opportunity to attend workshops at the Creativity Center, a joint project of Milwaukee Section — National Council of Jewish Women and MAJE. Idea books, including many original and exciting games and projects enhance the Homestart kits.

Parent Pacaje is a Jewish family experience which helps parents once again become the source for Bible stories and midrashim. The program also features Israel and the Hebrew language. Families assemble the "pacaje" activities together at home (toys, games, recipes, crafts, puppets, storyboards). The "pacajes" are picked up at workshops presented by the Creativity Center staff. They come complete with all materials and instructions needed to assemble each activity.

Both programs operate on a 2-year cycle. 1984-85 Homestart kits will include Chanukah, Purim and Shavuot. Parent Pacaje will deal with Israel, Hebrew and folk tales. Subscriptions are \$25.00/year for each program. Due to Rabbi Swickow's support for these programs, MAJE will subsidize both for \$5.00 each. Both make excellent gifts for friends and relatives in and out of the Milwaukee area. For further information, please call Sherry Glassman, Homestart/Parent Pacaje Coordinator, at 962-8860.
