BE A "PUMCM"

Translate that slogan any way you can to make it come out in your favor, but no matter what the solution those lucky Beth El Men's Club members on the PUMCM bandwagon are in for the treat of the season Wednesday night, November 26th.

November 27th will mark the annual Paid Up Men's Club dinner at the Synagogue's Holevi Hall. Each year this event draws a capacity crowd to participate in the well-rounded festivities.

The 1957 dinner will again feature sports celebrities, and for the first time in our history it will bring Hammerin' Hank Aaron to the Men's Club speaker's rostrum. The indomitable Braves' outfielder, on off-season tourist of the banquet circuit, should leave little to be desired in the way of outstanding entertainment. In addition, Chairman Harry Kolmas has lined up ex-Pokey star and radio commentator, Bob Forte, the well known WTMJ sports announcer, Blaine Walsh and the Braves' trainer, Joe Taylor. It was Taylor that will be remembered for "bringing down the house" with his Boston Irish interpretation of Yiddish dialect at last year's sports dinner.

A novel announcement for the meeting is planned by the Men's Club. Showing pictures of the guests, it will provide space for Hank Aaron's autograph, among others, making it a "must" for the kids.

In a departure from the usual plan for this program, the Men's Club directors have authorized a nominal charge of one dollar for the dinner and program. The charge will cover only a small part of the expenses for the evening, according to Kolmas. However, all members bringing in at least two new members for this term will be admitted without payment of the service charge. The treasurer will have facilities for dues payment at the door, and only paid-up members will be admitted. Any fathers who bring their sons will be charged an additional dollar, although Synagogue boy scouts in uniform will be guests of the club for

the dinner and program, as will all new members.

Following the invocation by Howard Bern, dinner will be served, then Vice-President Ed Nashban will introduce the presentations of colors by the Scout Troop members. The annual scout charter will be given to the Men's Club by Scout Commissioner Lou Goldstein. At the conclusion of the program, general card playing will get under way. The committee planning the evening has announced that the 1957 World Series film has not been released, but another program featuring this entertainment is planned for later in the Club's programming year.

It marks the initial salvo of Norman's return to the traditional dance forms after several years of concentration on the various latin interpretations. Norman hastens to assure his regular and new students, however, that the latin numbers will continue to be taught as part of the regular sessions.

Two separate groupings will be formed — for the beginners and the advanced dancers. The same charge made for the past two years of lessons will be made this year. Ten lessons will be given on every other Saturday night for a total charge of \$20.00. Sam Rosenberg and Bill Sheft are handling the roster and will take reservations for the lesson term.
