“THEY” AND WE

Recently a group of American rabbis released their "eye-witness" reports on the condition of Jews behind the Iron Curtain. Their findings represent much food for thought for the five million souls that comprise American Jewry.

While the constitution of the U.S.S.R. calls for religious freedom, the climate of modern-day Russia is actively antagonistic to religion in general. A Jew, whether religious or completely atheistic, must carry an identity card which indicates his nationality as "Jewish;" yet, he is not given the opportunity to find expression of his Jewishness through any of the means we enjoy here in these blessed United States. Thus, the Russian State possesses the sole right to educate all Russians from birth to the age of 18 — the most vital years in the life of any youth. This means that no child may receive any formal education in other than state-designated schools. Religious education as we know it here in Milwaukee — Hebrew School or Sunday School — is strictly forbidden. While the individual parent has the right to instruct his own child, he may not go further than that. Since parents themselves are today bereft of Jewish education, what Jewish knowledge can they impart to their children? For forty years, no new prayerbooks, Talesim, phylacteries, mezuzos, or Jewish calendars have been brought into the country — and none have been printed or made there. Added to this is the lamentable fact that in all Russia, there are only 100 rabbis, not one of whom is much below the age of 70! Not a single rabbi has been ordained or permitted to come into the country for over four decades.

Moscow, with a Jewish community of 500,000, has only three synagogues, with aggregate seating capacity of 1650; the city of Leningrad, with an estimated 250,000 Jews, possesses but one house of worship; Kiev and Odessa—one synagogue each; and the city of Kharkov, with almost 100,000 Jews—not even one formal synagogue. Despite the Government's antagonistic attitude, the visiting rabbis found, there is "genuine yearning for religious expression and identification."

What a striking contrast meets our eyes as we gaze upon the horizon of American Jewry! Our country is dotted with newly-erected magnificent synagogues. The membership rolls of congregations of all three movements in Judaism are swelled to the largest number in American Jewish history. Almost every conceivable avenue of Jewish expression and identification are within the reach of all. It would logically appear that of all countries in this 20th century world of ours, the United States offers the greatest opportunities for men and women of all creeds to live "normal" and active Jewish lives. In contrast with the conditions amidst which our brethren in Russia exist, our great American Jewish community, with all its blessings and media for religious and cultural self-expression, may rightfully be deemed a virtual Paradise on Earth.

On the eve of the New Year 5717, let us resolve to make use of the edifices and institutions we have built. Let us cultivate the art of praying; let us utilize our schools for the education and enlightenment of our youngsters in ever increasing measure; let us pluck the fruits of adult Jewish education, thereby enriching our understanding of Judaism; let us find time for active participation in the program of the synagogue, and its Sisterhood and Men's Club, as well. Let us concern ourselves with the needs of the community and the welfare of our brethren in the little, but great, democratic State of Israel. Let us live "Jewish" lives.

It is my prayer that the New Year may bring to all the affiliates of Beth El Ner Tamid, a year of good health, joy, and contentment; a year of peace for America, Israel, and all mankind.

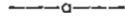
Cantor Gewirz comes from Savannah, Georgia, where he served the past year. Prior to that, he was Cantor of Congregations Ohev Shalom and Tifereth Israel, in Washington, D. C., where he served eight years.

The Cantor began his career at the age of eight when, as a child prodigy, he toured the country and conducted services in many synagogues. Since then he has been a concert and guest cantor and has appeared on radio and television. His musical education was acquired under the personal direction of the outstanding masters in Hebrew liturgical music. He attended the Chaim Berlin Yeshiva in Brooklyn, New York, and the School of Sacred Music at the University in Washington, D. C. Cantor Gewirz served in the United States Army. His wife is the former Annette Sond. They have two sons, Michael, age 10, and Brent, age 2.

The Choir, under the direction of Max Janowski, will assist Cantor Gewirz during the High Holy Days.

On Yam Kippur eve, the Rabbi will speak on the sermon topic: "WHO MAY RETURN"; preceding the Yizkor Service—"JUDGMENTS AND HOPES."

Cantor B. Gelbort, who has been with us for the past few years, will again conduct the Hebrew portion of the service on the Holy Days. Those who have heard his renditions have been imbued and inspired with his talented voice and artistic interpretation of the prayers.

SYNAGOGUE ETIQUETTE

All of us are anxious to make the High Holiday services inspiring, decorous, and dignified. To achieve those aims, your Ritual Committee and ushers seek your cooperation in the observance of the simple rule of decorum and synagogue conduct.

Conversation is distracting both to those conducting the services and to your neighbors. Please refrain from all conversation, even in a whisper.

Bring your Tallith with you. Do not remove it until the services are over—after the benediction.

Male worshippers will be provided with skullcaps and with the "High Holiday Prayer Book". These are not to be removed from the synagogue.

Refrain from assembling or smoking in lobby, entrance, or corridors.

Do not invite guests to visit you during the services.

Read the schedule of services (printed on the reverse side of your membership card.) Come to the services as early as possible and remain in your seats until they are concluded.

No one will be seated during the following portions of the services:

1. During the Rabbi's Sermon;
2. While the Ark is open;
3. While the Shofar is sounded;
4. During Special Prayers.

Please cooperate with the ushers. If you happen to be a late-comer, abide by your usher's request—wait until he permits you to enter.

If your assigned seats are in the Main Synagogue please use the rear door to leave or enter; congregants worshipping in Holevi Hall are requested to use the center door (Main Lobby) to leave or enter.

Children should not be brought into the synagogue. Special youth services, have been arranged for them.

Join heartily in the Hebrew and English responses and in congregational singing.

Occupy only those seats for which you can show tickets.

If all cooperate in the full observance of these regulations, indeed our services will be truly inspirational for each of us.

YOUTH SERVICES

High Holiday Services for children, ages 7 to 13 will be conducted in the Chapel and Kohl Hall under the direction of Messrs. William Kay, Mox Weinschenk, and Sam Silberstein. Youngsters who are 7 to 10 years of age will meet in Kohl Hall; ages 10 to 13, in the Chapel.

These services have been designed for your children **OVER THE AGE OF 7 AND UNDER 13**. If your child is below the age of 7, **PLEASE DO NOT BRING HIM TO THE CHAPEL OR KOHL HALL**, since Nursery Service will be available during the Holy Days in rooms 1 to 5 in the school wing.

NURSERY SERVICE

Nursery Service will be available for children, 3 to 7 years of age, on Rash Hashanah—Thursday and Friday—from 10 to 12:30, and Yom Kippur Day—Saturday, from 10 to 1:00 and 2:30 to 5:30 p.m.



PRAYER BOOKS

All male worshippers are requested to wear skull caps at the Holy Day services. These will be found in the Lobby, near the entrance to the Main Synagogue and Holevi Hall. The congregation will also provide each congregant with a copy of the High Holiday Prayer Book.

Since Prayer Books and Yarmulkes are the property of the Synagogue, members are requested to leave them at the Temple after the close of the service.



YOUR USHERS

Very few of our members realize how necessary it is to utilize the vital services of volunteer ushers for the High Holidays. Each year, a small group of men help us maintain a spirit in keeping with the dignity of the Holy Day Season. We cannot over-emphasize the necessity for complete cooperation with the ushers on the part of membership.

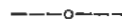
PLEASE COOPERATE with those members who have graciously accepted the task of helping us preserve decorous services this year.

Yahrzeit RECORDS

RULES GOVERNING BAR AND BAS MITZVAH

For the information of our membership, we find it advisable to reiterate the Synagogue's regulations governing the holding of Bar and Bas Mitzvah ceremonies at Beth El Ner Tamid.

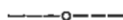
A minimum of four years of Hebrew School education is required as a prerequisite for having a Bar or Bas Mitzvah in our Congregation. Our rules require that such education must be obtained in a Hebrew School recognized by the Beth El Ner Tamid Synagogue, namely, Beth El Ner Tamid Hebrew School, East Side Hebrew School, and United Hebrew Schools. This means that all who are eight and one-half years old before September 1 must register in one of these recognized schools without delay, if they are to have the ceremony of Bar Mitzvah performed in our Synagogue at the age of 13. Candidates for Bar or Bas Mitzvah who have received instruction in any other school or by a private teacher are required to take an examination, in order to ascertain whether the applicant has covered the equivalent of four years of study in those subjects taught in the above mentioned recognized schools.

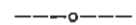

PROTESTANT GROUPS VISIT OUR SYNAGOGUE

Our Synagogue has been host to nine church groups of Protestant denominations during the summer months, including youth organizations of the Trinity Evangelical and Reform Church and Kingley Methodist Church.

On Wednesday, July 25, 120 members of the Wisconsin State College Summer Workshop visited the Synagogue. Following Rabbi Swickow's talk on the basic principles, ceremonies and observances of Judaism, a question and answer period ensued. The session was concluded with a tour of the Synagogue edifice.
