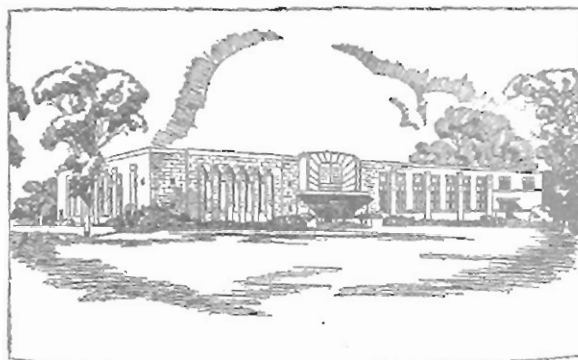

IN RETROSPECT

By Rabbi Louis J. Swickow

Judaism is unique in that it is essentially a way of life governed by the hand of time. So many ceremonial and ritual observances that constitute the essence of our religion are determined by our calendar. This is true of the Sabbath and Festivals, all of which, occurring as they do at particular points in time, enable the conscientious Jew to pause and reflect upon the spiritual values and ethical teachings inherent therein and, thereby, capture their significant values for improved daily living.

Especially is this observation evident with respect to the High Holidays of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. For the individual, these solemn days represent time set aside for careful self-examination and retrospection. He looks back over the past year of his life, with all its successes and failures, joys and sorrows, moments of apprehension and hours of re-assurance. And, reviewing what has transpired, he faces the future with mixed emotions, wondering what the newest cycle of time will usher in. To the Jewish people universally, the High Holidays present a rare opportunity for "taking stock" of spiritual and cultural gains and losses; a season for evaluating objectives, achievements, and unattained goals.

Viewing in retrospect the year just ended, we American Jews have much for which to be thankful.

Despite the lamentable fact that after more than two years of bloodshed in Korea, combat in that area has not abated, we are fortunate in that devastating warfare was not permitted to envelop the rest of our world - a fear we shared a year ago. That truce negotiations between the United Nations, under the leadership of the United States, and the Communist world, amidst most trying circumstances, are still being carried on to this hour, is a tribute to prudent and patient minds, bent on preventing universal war and destruction at all costs. These valiant efforts may yet prove for all time that war, as a means of settling international disputes and conflicts, is not inevitable.

The development and progress of the Republic of Israel during the year 5712 and the continued ingathering of the homeless to Zion cannot but evoke deep-seated satisfaction and gratitude. The large number of immigrants who entered the portals of the Promised Land during the past year is an indication that despite economic and financial strain and stress, austerity programs, and scarcities of essential foods, the gallant people who constitute the world's youngest democracy are determined to maintain their existence and growth for many centuries to come. How inspiring is the realization that more than 700,000 of our brethren and sisters have returned to the land of their fathers in a period of only four years; that thousands upon thousands of acres of land, desolate and forsaken throughout the ages, are now being reclaimed and resurrected; that instruments and arsenals of industrial production are sprouting throughout the country with unprecedented rapidity. Truly, the miracle of the new Israel must be regarded as one of the great wonders of our time.

FROM YOUR RITUAL COMMITTEE

All of us are anxious to make the High Holiday services inspiring, decorous, and dignified. To achieve those aims, your Ritual Committee and ushers seek your cooperation in the observance of the simple rules of decorum and synagogue conduct.

Conversation is distracting both to those conducting the services and to your neighbors. Please refrain from all conversation, even in a whisper.

Bring your Tallith with you. Do not remove it until the services are over.

Male worshippers will be provided with skullcaps and with the "High Holiday Prayer Book". These are not to be removed from the synagogue.

Refrain from assembling or smoking in the lobby, entrances, or corridors.

Do not invite guests to visit you during the services.

Read the schedule of services (printed on the reverse side of your membership card.) Come to the services as early as possible and remain in your seats until they are concluded.

No one will be seated during the following portions of the services:

1. During the Rabbi's sermon;
2. While the Ark is open;
3. While the Shofar is sounded;
4. During special prayers;

Please cooperate with the ushers. If you happen to be a late-comer, abide by your usher's request — wait until he permits you to enter.

If your assigned seats are in the Main Synagogue please use the rear door to leave or enter; congregants worshipping in Halevi Hall are requested to use the center door (Main Lobby) to leave or enter.

Children should not be brought into the synagogue. Special youth services have been arranged for them.

Join heartily in the Hebrew and English responses and in congregational singing.

Occupy only those seats for which you can show tickets.

If all cooperate in the full observance of these regulations, indeed, our services will be truly inspirational for each of us.

CHANGES IN HEBREW AND SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAMS NOW IN EFFECT

In accordance with the action taken by the Board of Trustees last December, changes with regard to prerequisites for Bar Mitzvah, Bas Mitzvah, and Confirmation became effective with the beginning of the new school year, on September 2nd. These changes, submitted after much study and deliberation by the School Committee, effect the programs of our Hebrew and Sunday Schools. Adopted with the view of elevating Jewish educational standards in our Synagogue, they are in line with the current trend in similar Conservative schools.

In order that parents may be fully informed as to the new regulations now in effect, the new standards and changes are as follows:

1. PREREQUISITE HEBREW SCHOOL EDUCATION FOR BAR AND BAS MITZVAH - 3½ years; beginning with February, 1953 - 4 years. (This means that as of next February, boys and girls who plan to become Bar or Bas Mitzvah must be not older than the age of 9 when enrolling in our Hebrew School).
2. PREREQUISITE HEBREW SCHOOL EDUCATION FOR CONFIRMATION - 1½ years of Hebrew School training; beginning with September, 1953, 2 years of such education will be required for girls as a prerequisite for Confirmation in our Synagogue.
3. All pupils enrolled in the Hebrew School, except those 13 to 15 years of age (corresponding to the 8th and 9th grades of public school), will meet for the third day of attendance on SATURDAY, 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.
4. Regular Sunday School classes will be conducted on SUNDAYS for all grades except 6th and 7th.
5. Prospective Confirmands who have not yet fulfilled the minimum Hebrew School educational requirements for Confirmation will be expected to take their two years of Hebrew School training between the ages of 11 and 13, corresponding to the 6th and 7th grades of public school.
6. Pupils who have fulfilled the Hebrew School requirements before entering the 6th or 7th grades will attend religious school classes on SATURDAYS during those grades.

We ask that both parents and pupils familiarize themselves with the above regulations. For information or further clarification, please call Rabbi Swickow, HI 1122 2-4520.
