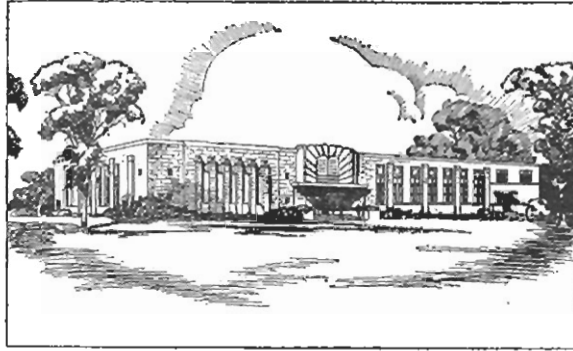

PREREQUISITES FOR

BAS MITZVAH AND CONFIRMATION

Last year, the ceremony of Bas Mitzvah was established as a permanent feature of the Beth El Ner Tamid Synagogue.

Girls who receive a minimum of three years of Hebrew School training prior to their 13th birthday are eligible for Bas Mitzvah.

A minimum of one year of Hebrew is required for all girls who expect to be confirmed at Beth El Ner Tamid.

Too often do parents fail to realize that this requirement must be fulfilled long before their daughters enter the 9th grade. We respectfully advise our membership to enroll their daughters in our Hebrew School well in advance of the age of 10.

PLEASE . . .

All of us are anxious to make the High Holiday services inspiring, decorous, and dignified. To achieve those aims, your Ritual Committee and ushers seek your cooperation in the observance of the simple rules of decorum and synagogue conduct.

Conversation is distracting both to those conducting the services and to your neighbors. Please refrain from all conversation, even in a whisper.

Bring your Tallith with you. Do not remove it until the services are over.

Male worshippers will be provided with skullcaps and with the "High Holiday Prayer Book." These are not to be removed from the synagogue.

Refrain from assembling or smoking in the lobby, entrances, or corridors.

Do not invite guests to visit you during the services.

Read the schedule of services (printed on the reverse side of your membership card.) Come to the services as early as possible and remain in your seats until they are concluded.

No one will be seated during the following portions of the services:

(1) during the Robbi's sermon; (2) while the Ark is open; (3) during special prayers and responsive readings. Please cooperate with the ushers. If you happen to be a late-comer, abide by your ushers' request - wait until he permits you to enter.

Children should not be brought into the synagogue. Special youth services have been arranged for them.

Join heartily in the Hebrew and English responses and in congregational singing.

Occupy only those seats for which you can show tickets.

If all cooperate in the full observance of these regulations, indeed, our services will be truly inspirational for each of us.

FESTIVAL OF SUKKOTH

Known as Sukkoth, the third holiday of the Hebrew month, Tishri, is observed seven days.

Services will be held on Sunday and Monday evenings, October 14th and 15th, at 8:00 o'clock, and on Monday and Tuesday, October 15th and 16th, at 9:00 a. m.

Our Sukkah will be decorated by the Sisterhood, and after the conclusion of each service during the first two days of the Festival, Kiddush will be chanted and refreshments, appropriate for the season, will be served there.

SHEMINI ATZERETH AND SIMCHAS TORAH

Immediately following Sukkoth, comes the festival known as Shemini Atzereth, which is observed for two days.

Services will be held Sunday evening, October 21st, at 8:00 o'clock and at 9:00 a.m. Monday, October 22nd. Memorial services (Yizkor) will be recited Monday, at 10:00 o. m.

Simchos Torah will be observed Monday evening, October 22nd, at 7:30 p.m. The Torah scrolls will be carried in procession, followed by the children. Flags and refreshments will be distributed to all children present.

At the services of Consecration on Monday evening, new pupils of the Sunday School will formally participate in a special induction ceremony.

Services for the morning of Simchos Torah will be conducted Tuesday, October 23rd, at 9:00 a.m.
